

#### MATH

This week we started Chapter 7: Decimals. Important vocabulary terms for this week include: tenth, hundredth, decimal form, decimal point, and expanded form. We reviewed the place value chart to gain a deeper understanding of the difference between whole numbers and parts of whole numbers. The digits to the left of the decimal point are whole numbers. The first two places to the right of the decimal point are the tenths place- one tenth of one whole and the hundredths place- one hundredth of one whole. Students learned about decimals as an extension of place-value notation. They learned how to show amounts that are parts of a whole using decimals and that a decimal point is used to separate the whole number part and the fractional part. Students learned to write tenths and hundredths in decimal and fractional forms, how to regroup tenths as ones, and how to express mixed numbers and improper fractions as decimals.

-We continued testing students on their multiplication facts.

-Students have been exploring "Section U: Decimals" of IXL on their iPads. Please encourage them to continue their progress on IXL at home.

-Students expressed how they gained clarity from watching the Khan Academy videos posted on our class website. Please note there are several more videos on that terrific website. We recommend that you watch some of the videos with your children! ©

This week we finished the novels we were reading together during guided reading. We are so proud of the hard work,

We continue to encourage them to apply the active reading strategies we have been employing during our novel studies to their own reading pursuits.
