Students are loving Andrew Clement's book Frindle! This week during reading, 4A read up to chapter 12 and 4B read up to chapter 13. We have been discussing characters, questioning as we read, making connections (text-to-text, text-to-self, and text-to-world), visualizing, and making inferences. In their reading response journals, we discussed that sometimes everything the author wants you to know is not "right there" in the text. However, we can make "inferences" to read between the lines. An inference combines our background knowledge with evidence from the text to find the bigger ideas that the author leaves unwritten for us to figure out.
